PUBLIC HOLIDAY.

WHEREAS a definitive Treaty of Peace between Her Majesty and Her Allies, and his Imperial Majesty the Emperor of all the Russias, was concluded at Paris, on the 30th day of March last, and the ratifications thereof have been duly exchanged; His Excellency the Governor, in order to afford the inhabitants an opportunity of commemorating so propitious an event, has been pleased to direct that throughout the Province of Auckland Wednesday the 13th instant shall be observed as a Public Holiday, and that throughout each of the other Provinces of this Colony such day as the Superintendent of such Province may appoint after the receipt of this Gazette shall be observed in like manner.
